Recommendation

1. That Report TR-CW-01-18 regarding a summary of the 2017 School Litter Pick-Up Program be received for information.

Executive Summary

The School Litter Pick-Up Program encourages schools in Grey County to participate in keeping County roads clean in exchange for financial compensation of \$41.24 per kilometer of road cleaned.

Background and Discussion

Two schools participated in the County's School Litter Pick-Up Program in 2017. The kilometers of road cleaned increased by 13% compared to last year.

Transportation Services reviewed the program internally, as well as with the individual schools prior to the spring of 2017 to encourage participation. Twelve elementary schools were provided with School Litter Pick-Up Program and staff contact information for further communication.

Some of the comments received from the schools included:

- Unaware of the program
- Hard to organize with parents and teachers
- Liability issues
- Small class size

On a positive note, the 2 schools that participated were very appreciative of the opportunity to raise money for their various school projects and functions. Transportation Services is committed to promoting this program again in 2018 by using the positive feedback from these 2 participating schools from this year in our information package.
