### Background

The school litter pick-up program encourages schools in Grey County to participate in keeping County roads clean in exchange for financial compensation of \$25.00 per kilometer of road cleaned.

Four schools participated in the County's School Litter Pick-Up Program in 2014. The kilometers of road cleaned decreased by 32% compared to last year. No incidents were reported in 2014 regarding this program.
